No topics were discussed other than those listed on the public meeting notice. All members were present with the exception of Mr. Browning.

COMMUNICATIONS & REPORTS

SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS

Mrs. Ahlbrand reported that March is Disability Awareness Month. She introduced Beth White from SEPAC (Special Education Advisory Council). Mrs. White presented a \$40 check for each special education teacher and therapist totaling \$1920.00 to use as needed in their classrooms to benefit the special education students. She thanked the special education teachers and staff for all they do. She also said it has been a pleasure for SEPAC to work with Mrs. Ahlbrand and Mrs. Helmsing. Mr. Silver moved to accept the donation and Mr. Klosterman seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Fosbrink reported the Indiana State Police completed bus inspections in January and February for the forty-five corporation buses. Only one bus required a minor repair of a step light bulb and it was repaired the same day.

Mr. Shaffner thanked Mr. Bush and Mrs. Noelker for their leadership with the Math Bowl at Redding Elementary. On February 23, 2017, 155 students participated on 10 teams in the Math Bowl. Brown Elementary and Jackson Elementary tied on the fourth tiebreaker. Brown Elementary went on to win the large school division. Emerson Elementary won first place in the small school division. Mr. Shaffner thanked everyone who helped make it a great event.

Mr. Stark announced that the work at the farm school is progressing well. The walls are up and the steel for the roof is in place. They expect to complete the work by the end of June.

BOARD COMMENTS

Mrs. Franke gave "kudos" to Mr. Manns and Mr. Stark for the work their departments did to make the IHSAA Boys Basketball Sectional and Regionals a success.

ACTION ITEMS

Mr. Nauman made a recommendation to accept textbook reimbursement funds in the amount of \$194,745.75 for the 2016-2017 school year. Mr. Joray moved and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mrs. Helmsing made a recommendation to accept the \$960.00 from ARC of Jackson County (\$750), Wal-Mart Distribution Center (\$200), and Help at Home (\$20) for the Transition Fair. The fair took place on March 8. She reported 166 students attended from Seymour, Trinity, and Brownstown. Mrs. Franke motioned to approve the donation and Mr. Kelley seconded. Motion carried: 6-0.

Mr. Hack made a recommendation to accept a donation of wooden toys from local Lions Club members, Ruel West and Bob McElhaney and the Central Indiana Woodworkers of Indianapolis. They would like to donate approximately 70 toys each grading period to the positive character education program at Brown. Mrs. Franke moved and Mr. Klosterman seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Hooker made a recommendation to approve the education blueprint documents including the timeline, fast facts packet, and 100+ patron letter. Mrs. Franke motioned to move forward with the documents and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Ms. Driver made a recommendation to approve the Summer Feed Program dates. A free breakfast and lunch will be served to students 18 and under at Brown Elementary and Seymour Middle School June 5 - July 28, 2017. Mr. Silver motioned to approve the dates and Mrs. Franke seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Ms. Driver made a recommendation to raise the student lunch price by the minimum required ten cents (.10). All other meal prices will remain the same for the 2017-2018 school year. Mrs. Franke motioned to approve and Mr. Joray seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Prange made a recommendation to approve the following statement into policy, "The Board shall review the corporation vision statements at least every other three years or whenever a new Board member or Superintendent joins the corporation. Following these reviews the Board may revise or reaffirm the direction it has established for the corporation." Mrs. Franke moved and Mr. Kelley seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Prange made a recommendation to approve the Workplace Mentoring Program agreement between Big Brothers Big Sisters and the Seymour High School JAG program. The program will begin in the 2017-2018 school year. Mr. Klosterman moved and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mrs. Altemeyer requested permission to apply for the Indiana Early Intervention grant. Mr. Klosterman moved and Mrs. Franke seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Manns made a recommendation to accept a quote from Knight Audio for \$27,000 for the SHS Football Stadium sound system. He also made a recommendation to accept a quote from Knight Audio for \$12,600 for the Soccer stadium sound system. Mrs. Franke motioned to approve the quotes from Knight Audio and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Nauman made a recommendation to purchase the materials for the Band department uniform racks. The Owl Manufacturing class will build the carts. The total cost of the carts will be \$11,524.89 to be paid out of capital project fund. Mrs. Franke moved and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Stark made a recommendation to approve the maintenance agreement quotes requested by the Board earlier in the year. Mrs. Franke motioned to approve as presented and Mr. Silver seconded. Motion carried; 6-0.

Mr. Stark made a recommendation to move forward with the replacement of the Jackson Elementary chiller. He said it is failing and the lead time for the arrival of new equipment is 6-8 weeks. Mrs. Franke motioned to approve the standard chiller from Best Way Mechanical and Mr. Klosterman seconded. After much discussion, Mrs. Franke motioned to rescind her earlier motion and Mr. Joray seconded. Mr. Kelley made a motion to allow Mr. Stark and administration to get returns and to justify if the high efficiency chiller is worth the additional cost. Mrs. Franke seconded. Motion carried; 4-2 with Mr. Klosterman and Mr. Silver opposing.

NEW BUSINESS - FIRST READ ITEMS

Mr. Hack presented quotes for the redesign of the Brown Elementary front office area. He will return for second read next month.

Mrs. Ferguson presented the 2017-2018 student handbooks. She welcomed suggestions or corrections prior to the next Board meeting.

Mr. Stark made a recommendation to request quotes for summer maintenance work: engineered wood fiber for corporation playgrounds, carpet replacement, and parking lot repairs. He will return with a recommendation to award the work later this spring.

Mrs. Reinhart presented a policy that would address breastfeeding in the workplace. The guidelines show the responsibilities for both the workplace and the employee.

Mr. Nauman presented 2018 budget information.
